

Illustrated Timeline: Changes Over Time in Japan and China Up to the Modern Era

Due Date: Friday, January 31th

Points: 50 HW/50 Exam (which will include 2 short answer questions on the due date)

Objective: Students will be able to identify and explain the most important changes and events of China and Japan up until the Modern Era (20th Century), and why they were important in changing the societies of each civilization.

Materials: Pencils, colors, 4 sheets of white paper (x2).

Task: Students will create 2 illustrated timelines, in book form, with a brief explanation of the change/event, in chronological order, and with an illustration that follows the artwork criteria.

General Guidelines

1. Select 15 items from the history of Japan and China. (30 total)
 - a. I'm providing the beginning date and end date for each:
 - i. Japan—Begin with 8,000 BCE and end with the Meiji Restoration
 - ii. China—Begin with 8,000 BCE and end with the Revolution of 1911.;
2. Japan—Use pages 301-317; 493-503; 651-663
3. China—Use pages 64-90; 269-298; 479-493; 637-651
4. Be sure to select the most important changes for each civilization.
5. Follow the rubric on the back for full credit. Follow it closely, as this is the majority of your assessment for Chapter 17 (parts of Ch. 22).
